The Annual League Conference offers you an excellent value in keeping your staff as well as your elected officials well informed. This year the League is offering many sessions of interest to your elected officials, including those on the topics of Ethics, Budgeting, Open Public Meetings, and Public Procurement. Elected officials who participate in the Local Government Leadership Program will be able to receive points for attending these classes. Also please remember to register your staff in August to take advantage of the pre-registration rate of \$55 for members and \$105 for nonmembers. Pre-registration ends October 1. Pre-registration runs through October 1. After the pre-registration period has ended, attendees must pay for their registration onsite at the Atlantic City Convention Center. On-site registration rates are \$65 for Government Officials and \$125 for non-government officials.

It has come to our attention that there are unauthorized firms soliciting housing and hotel reservations from League conference attendees.

Please Note: The only firm authorized to handle our conference housing reservations is AC Central Reservations. They will not call, email, or contact anyone unsolicited.

You can visit their website via the League Conference page.

Using unauthorized reservation services creates real problems for you and the Conference as a whole. You cannot be assured your credit card or financial information is secure, and your room reservation may not actually be made. Also, your room will not be part of the official Conference housing block, so you won't get emergency housing information, nor will there be adequate shuttle bus services to your hotel.
